



FORGING NEW TRADITIONS


- · Publishing born-digital and born-again-digital scholarly research

WHAT'S THE PROBLEM?



ANVIL'S MISSION

- · Bring analog publisher's services to digital humanities
- · Peer review, edit, promote, distribute digital scholarship
- Serve as gatekeeper and exemplar
- Demonstrate the legitimacy of digitally mediated scholarship

"If we libraries change our purchasing practices, we'll put publishers out of business. Their whole business model is based on selling books to libraries that no one wants to read."

IT'S LITERALLY TRUE!

- 1998-2008, book usage in college libraries down 38 percent
- Cornell University 2010 study: 55 percent of books purchased since 1990 have never circulated.
- 4 percent of college and university faculty begin search in the library building
- · 0 percent of students begin researching a paper in the library



SEATTLE UNIVERSITY

60 percent of library acquisitions are now digital Print materials isolated, front space used for workstations

NARRATIVE

- Not the death of literacy
- · Simply a change of medium
- Need for new means of delivery
- "digital storytelling"
- · "digitally mediated scholarship"

This project - the Stanford Integrated Digital Library Project (SIDLP) - is to develop the enabling technologies for a single, integrated and "universal" library, proving uniform access to the large number of emerging networked information sources and collections. These include both on-line versions of preexisting works and new works and media of all kinds that will be available on the globally interlinked computer networks of the future. The Integrated Digital Library is broadly defined to include everything from personal information collections, to the collections that one finds today in conventional libraries, to the large data collections shared by scientists. The technology developed in this project will provide the "glue" that will make this worldwide collection usable as a unified entity, in a scalable and economically viable fashion.

PROGRESS?

- > 12 million books scanned
- · Goal is 130 million books: entire history of the printed book
- They cannot be stopped (nor should they be)
- · World's entire cultural record is destined to be digital


- "The DPLA is leading the first concrete steps toward the realization of a large-scale digital public library that will make the cultural and scientific record available for all."


REACTIVE, NOT PROACTIVE



SIX DEGREES OF DANISH BACON


